HAZARDOUS MATERIALS EMERGENCY RESPONSE AWARENESS WORKSHOP

- Anhydrous Ammonia Build product awareness, uses, characteristics, and first responder strategies
- Propane Build product awareness, characteristics, and first responder strategies
- Chlorine Build product awareness, uses and characteristics, and first responder strategies
- Flammable Liquids Characteristics of flammable liquids and emergency response strategies
- Transport Canada Provide information regarding ERAP (Emergency Response Assistance Plan), North American Emergence Response Guide and industry response requirements
- Evacuation or Shelter-in-Place When to do, how to do, pros and cons of each

The **outdoor activities** are being finalized but we are anticipating:

- Cargo tanks review design, construction and safety features of tank trucks
- Emergency response and spill contractor equipment displays
- Support agency displays and equipment
